DAY 1

Have you ever thought of the words *freedom* and *Jesus* fitting together, without the word *isn't* in between? Many people think that the Christian life consists of nothing but strict rules and regulations, but the truth is that there's no other place where true freedom is found, apart from Christ. A relationship with God brings a complete change in our lives, and when we think about all that He has done for us, we are free to celebrate lives honoring all He has done.

DAY 2

DAY 3

Eternal equals forever. It's so easy for us to think only about our current lives and everything that is happening around us in this world. But if you have accepted Christ's love, everything that is happening is only a blip on the radar of forever.

Make a timeline of your life so far. What are the major moments – good and bad – that have happened to you so far? Spend some time in prayer dreaming with God about what forever will look like, and then make it a point to worship twice in the car this week as a reminder that our lives are eternal in Christ.

DAY 4

Christmas means a time that we get some extra hope—hope to get out more than we usually get to, a new phone, or a chance to start over at new year. No matter hope we can celebrate, at Christmas we can celebrate Christmas. It's because of what the Christmas story represents. It's about a God who wanted to be with us and did everything to do so. Because of this God, Jesus, we can have hope, no matter what your life looks like today. What would it look like for you to put your hope in Jesus today?

DAY 5

Aren't gifts great? God sent His Son, Jesus, to Earth—as a gift. Why? Because it was a way to save us from sin. It was a gift so great, that we don't have to wait until the next year or until we miss having it around—we can remember it every Christmas season and every day. The Christmas season is also a time where we can think about the way our faith changes our relationships with others too. It's a lot to be thankful for.

Today, challenge yourself to talk with someone in your life about how thankful you are for God's love. Then, ask them to share how they've seen God's love at work in their own life during this season.

DAY 6

Being let down can be the worst. You counted on them to keep a promise, you hoped in one way or another, or you expected something different. But it didn't work out. While it's not what we hope to happen—it's one of the most painful parts of being in a relationship with others. But our relationship with God is different.
